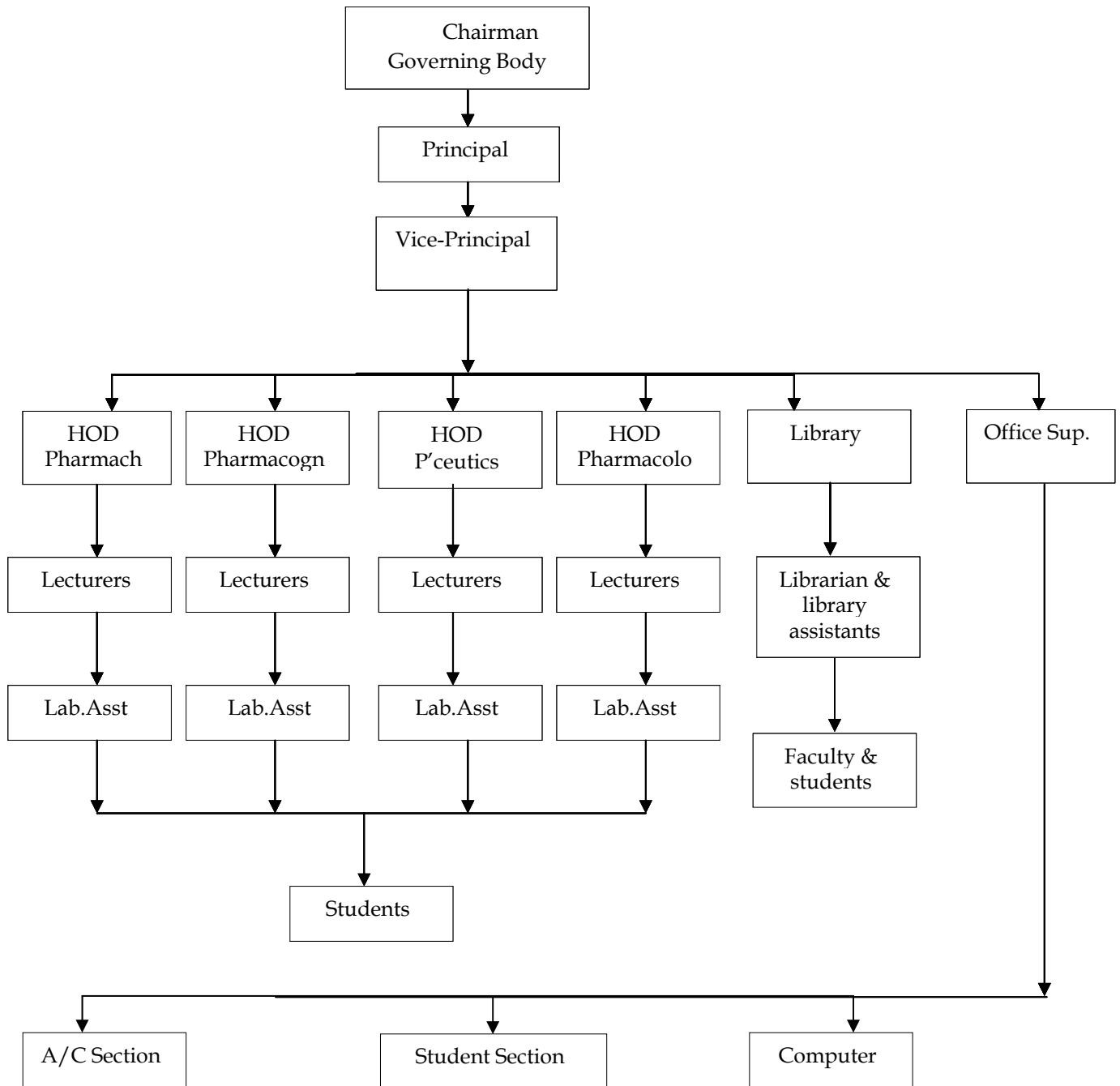

❖ **Nature and Extent of involvement of faculty and students in academic affairs/improvements**

Sessional examinations are conducted and the respective subject teachers and class teacher of the class call those students whose performance is poor. Extra coaching, extension of library facility etc. is provided. Academic matters are also discussed in student council meeting. Students are also given an opportunity to discuss academic discussions. Extra coaching and library facilities are given for GATE students too.

Faculty of the institute is involved in examination, seminars, group discussions and other co-curriculum activities like blood donation camps, scientific exhibitions and annual sports and social activities. Students are also involved in many social activities like AIDS awareness campaign, blood donation and medical camps, social gathering as well as annual sports etc.

❖ **Mechanism/Norms & Procedure for democratic/good Governance**

Redressal committee has been framed in the institute through which the process of governance is carried out. Any disputes regarding staff or students are put in front of redressal committee and tried to solve mutually / face to face. Platform is provided to dissolve the dispute and ways are searched unanimously to solve the problem. Warning is given if person is found guilty.

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the HSC (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of secondary and higher secondary education or its equivalent examination with subjects English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Mathematics AND secured minimum 50% marks. (Minimum 45% marks in case of candidates of backward class categories belonging only to Maharashtra State) in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Mathematics added together (Maximum of marks obtained in Biology or Mathematics shall be considered for the purpose of addition).

OR

Must have passed final year Diploma in Pharmacy Examination of Board of Technical Education (M.S.) or equivalent examination of Board with not less than 50% of marks in the aggregate of all subjects taken together at the final examination at one and the same sitting.

#### **Direct Second Year Admission**

#### **Eligibility criteria for Direct Admission to the Second Year B. Pharm.**

Candidate who has passed the final examination of D. Pharm. course conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Technical Education or equivalent from the institute approved by Pharmacy Council of India with minimum 60% marks are eligible for taking admission to Second. Year. B. Pharm.
